## **DAY 1: MAKER MONDAY**

#### FIRE-BREATHING DRAGONS



### **ACTIVITY/CONCENTRATION**

#### **Description of Activity:**

- **STEP 1:** Prep for this lesson by cutting pieces of purple, red, and green construction paper to wrap around cardboard rolls.
- STEP 2: Tell students this week they will be reading stories and learning about mythical creatures. Ask; "What is a myth? They're stories that have been told for hundreds of years and are used to explain how things came to be. They are fiction, which means they aren't real. This week we'll be talking about these special characters."
- **STEP 3:** Read the book *How to Catch a Dragon\_*by Adam Wallace. Have students identify the parts of the dragon (tail, wings, horns, etc.).
- **STEP 4:** Give each student a cardboard roll and allow them to choose purple, red, or green paper to wrap around their tube.
- STEP 5: Have students use large colored pompoms to create eyes. Attach googly eyes to each pompom with a glue dot or glue, then add the eyes to top of the tube using additional glue dots.
- STEP 6: Have students attach 2 small pompoms to the front of the tube to create nostrils.
- STEP 7: Attach red, yellow, and orange ribbon to the inside of the tubes below the nostrils. Students can now blow through the back of their dragon's head to make them breathe fire!
